What is a Parish Council?

The villages of Burston and Shimpling form one parish in South Norfolk, 5 miles to the north east of the market town of Diss, in the Waveney Valley.

Parish and Town Councils are the local level of government in the England. They are independent bodies and have responsibility for representing all residents in the parish, running some local services, commenting on planning applications and long-term development issues. Collecting money for their budget through the 'precept' as part of council tax. And also have wide-ranging powers to become involved in further activities that contribute towards the improvement of the environment and quality of life in the parish.

Diss

Diss is an ancient Norfolk market town, close to the Suffolk border in the Waveney Valley. The town boasts historic churches, pockets of attractive woodland and a variety of shops, restaurants and cafes. It's noted for its wonderful Mere and fountain, which form the centrepiece of the town.

Local specialist shops in the Heritage Triangle area of the town, especially in the historic yards, Cobbs Yard, Norfolk House Yard and Hales Yard as well as around the Market Place and along Mere Street sell a range of unique goods, from craft gifts and antiques to vintage clothing and fine foods. There is also the Corn Hall an arts and entertainment venue.

Diss is also where to find the library, Leisure Centre with swimming pool, supermarkets, service stations, garden centres, and Vets. To the east of the town centre along Victoria Road towards the railway station, are many more useful shops and facilities.

Regular Events

Burston War Memorial

This was built and supported by many local people to honour the Burston men who didn't return from the First World War. There is a memorial book in the plinth. There is a service on Church Green to lay wreaths on Remembrance Sunday.



Burston Strike School Rally-the first Sunday in September on Church Green

This is a popular event and can attract 100s and occasionally 1000s people from all over the country depending who is speaking. See page 8 for a brief history of the Strike School.

St Georges Shimpling is now redundant and is managed by the Churches Conservation Trust, <u>information here</u>.

The church is grade 1 listed and parts date from the 12th century with later additions.

Two regular events are held here, Candlelit Carols on the Thursday of the week before Christmas and a service on St George's Day (23rd April).

Recreation Ground

The Parish Recreation Ground is situated on Crown Green next to the school. It has an extensive range of facilities for all ages, including a BMX track, 7-aside football pitch, basket ball hoop, exercise equipment, play area (with zip-wire) and Pétanque court.

Mains water is supplied by <u>Anglia Water</u> There is much information on their website at https://www.anglianwater.co.uk/ covering their services and options to have alerts for stoppages to supply. You can also report leaks.

Some parts of Burston also have access to mains sewerage, but most properties in the Parish use private treatment plants.

Heating Oil—this is supplied by various companies through out Norfolk. There are also clubs you can join to get a discount from bulk buying.

<u>Community Action Norfolk</u> thinkingfuel is one such scheme that supplies oil in the Parish

There are Open Reach cabinets in Burston (Crown Green) and Shimpling (Dickleburgh Road) for traditional telephone and broadband provision from a variety of suppliers (BT, Sky etc.)

The Burston Strike School was at the centre of the longest running strike in British history, between 1914 and 1939.

The strike began when teachers at the village's Church of England school, Annie Higdon and her husband, Tom Higdon, were sacked after a dispute with the area's school management committee

and schoolchildren went on strike in their support. The Higdons set up an alternative school which was attended by 66 of their 72 former pupils. Beginning in a marquee on the village green, the school moved to local carpenter's premises and later to a purpose-built school financed by donations from the labour movement. Burston Strike School carried on teaching local children until shortly after Tom's death in 1939.

The Burston Strike School Museum is on Diss Road Burston IP22 4HS. There is parking next to the building. A rally is held every year on the first Sunday in September. Details on the website at https://www.unitetheunion.org/newsevents/events/burston-strike-school-rally

It is in the centre of Diss Market Place in the old Shambles building, once a butcher's shop. There are several car parks within walking distance.

As of March 2022, the Museum will be open on a Friday, Saturday and Monday, 11am to 3pm, as well as Sundays if there is an event happening in the town.

Admission is free. The Museum is wheelchair accessible.

Transport



Burston has a limited bus service provided by Konectbus Service 1 between Norwich and Diss. The stop in Burston is by the Burston Crown pub on Diss Road.

Borderhoppa Community Transport is a registered not for profit charity and has been in operation since 2002. The group has offices in south Norfolk and has a team of paid staff, drivers and volunteers.

The service currently covers parishes in south Norfolk and north Suffolk and continues to grow.

To use the Dial-a-Ride service all passengers need to become members. As from 1st February 2023 the membership fee is £15 per year.
